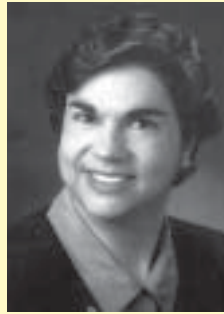

Diabetes Health Center

Awareness. Growth. Hope. These are a few of the key themes imparted to diabetes patients and their families at the Diabetes Health Center (DHC). A program of the Trust, the DHC provides culturally competent Diabetes Self-Management Education and Medical Nutrition Therapy to residents of the Pajaro Valley.



Since 1999 the DHC has taught thousands of individuals to understand and manage their diabetes, helping them to avoid the serious complications the disease too often brings with it. In addition to learning about medications and managing blood sugars, clients avail themselves of our Medical Nutrition Therapy program to help them make healthy lifestyle changes. We expect that these services will help reduce both the incidence and severity of diabetes in the future.

While the DHC's outreach efforts provide diabetes awareness and prevention information, DHC staff have found unexpected benefits from community contact. Through relating their career paths and their passion for their work, DHC staff encourage local youth to pursue careers of their own in the health professions.

These are just a few of the ways the DHC touches our community and we are eager to make an even greater impact as this program continues to grow.

Regional Diabetes Efforts Gain National Attention

When the Trust convened the Regional Diabetes Collaborative (RDC) in September 2002, our vision was to join forces with a diverse group of health professionals throughout the tri-county area to support, promote and coordinate efforts to prevent and manage diabetes.

The strong collaborative framework of the RDC, joined with the efforts of other health partners in the county, resulted in an invitation to take part in a national summit called *Crossing the Quality Chasm*, hosted by the Institute of Medicine (IOM) in Washington D.C.

The Summit, the second meeting convened by the IOM to address chronic care issues, examined and discussed next steps in restructuring the way we deliver care for people with chronic diseases such as diabetes. Santa Cruz County was one of only 15 communities around the nation invited to attend.

Continuing our efforts, the Trust and the Regional Diabetes Collaborative, in partnership with the Health Improvement Partnership, will host several diabetes activities this year, including a Regional Diabetes Forum. The Forum will feature a keynote speaker and expert panel presentations designed to create *a sense of both urgency and possibility* for improving diabetes care in our region.

The Power of Collaboration

Collaboration is an appealing strategy for problem solving, yet true collaboration is often difficult to achieve. Our community has an exceptional record of creating strong and well-organized collaboratives built around shared goals and commitments in order to rise above individual differences.

The Trust is pleased to be an active partner in several county-wide and regional health planning efforts that tie closely to our health care mission and to the four priority areas we are addressing in our strategic plan: *Diabetes, Oral Health, Youth (6-21) and Farm Workers and their Families*:

Central Coast Nutrition and Fitness Collaborative

Members from Monterey and Santa Cruz Counties are promoting healthy eating and physical activity, particularly among children, in Central Coast communities.

Go For Health Collaborative

A broad cross section of stakeholders, convened by the United Way, is developing a comprehensive plan to address the problem of childhood obesity throughout Santa Cruz County.

Health Improvement Partnership of Santa Cruz County

Key health care leaders convene to tackle a variety of health planning, quality care and industry challenges.

Healthy Kids Collaborative of Santa Cruz County

Private and public sector partners, convened by the Community Foundation of Santa Cruz County, are expanding health insurance coverage for the children of Santa Cruz County.

Human Care Alliance

Members advocate for human care services, promote collaboration and diversity and encourage noncompetitive cultivation of private and public funding.

Regional Diabetes Collaborative

Convened by the Trust, RDC members work to support, promote and coordinate efforts to prevent and manage diabetes in the tri-county area.

Safety Net Coalition of Santa Cruz County

Community-based clinics and health centers are strengthening their capacity to provide primary health care to the uninsured and medically underserved in the community.



Spotlight on Oral Health

Over the past two years, the Pajaro Valley Community Health Trust has provided \$90,000 in grants to help improve the oral health of our community. This year we took a hard look at what we could do to specifically help the youth of the Pajaro Valley. We not only wanted to find ways for them to receive the treatment they desperately need, but to understand how to better prevent dental disease.



To formulate a plan, the Trust brought together an advisory group to discuss strategies for oral health education and disease prevention. From this meeting surfaced a plan to fund a project to provide Comprehensive Perinatal Services Program (CPSP) providers with formal oral health prevention training which they will then routinely provide to the pregnant women and families they serve.

Following a competitive grant proposal process, the Trust awarded \$30,000 to the County of Santa Cruz Health Services Agency to carry out this prevention project in the Pajaro Valley. We are looking forward to the development of this program over the coming year and to assessing the impact it has on the oral health of Pajaro Valley residents.

In addition to underwriting prevention strategies, the Trust is also committed to supporting oral health treatment services. For this reason, the Trust awarded a grant of \$25,499 to Salud Para La Gente to provide dental services at the Pajaro Valley Unified School District's *Children's Resource Center*. This Center, located at Alianza School, provides health services to youth throughout the district, many of whom lack health insurance or access to health and dental care services.

- Pajaro Valley Prevention and Student Assistance - \$15,000 for violence prevention and conflict resolution program
- Pajaro Valley Unified School District Healthy Start - \$4,000 for replacement eye glasses for low-income students
- Population Services International - \$4,000 for a family conference on violence prevention
- Santa Cruz AIDS Project - \$7,000 for "Horas Para Mujeres," at Casa Bienestar youth center
- Santa Cruz Community Counseling Center - \$7,000 for El Apoyo clean and sober classroom
- Watsonville Family YMCA - \$7,000 for Out of School Time middle school program
- Watsonville High School Health Careers Academy - \$7,000 to encourage high school students to enter health careers
- Scholarships - \$40,000 for Pajaro Valley youth from the following institutions pursuing health careers: Watsonville High School, Aptos High School, Cabrillo College and UCSC

**Grant made FY 02/03 and redirected toward listed agency in FY 03/04.*

Program Support for Fiscal Year 2002/2003

- Diabetes Health Center - \$221,891 to increase awareness and help prevent and reduce the incidence of complications associated with diabetes by providing culturally competent Diabetes Prevention and Self Management Education and Medical Nutrition Therapy to residents of the greater Pajaro Valley area.
- Regional Diabetes Collaborative - \$17,000 to bring together organizations and individuals from throughout the tri-county area to work on issues such as diabetes education and prevention, public policy, clinical management and best practices.

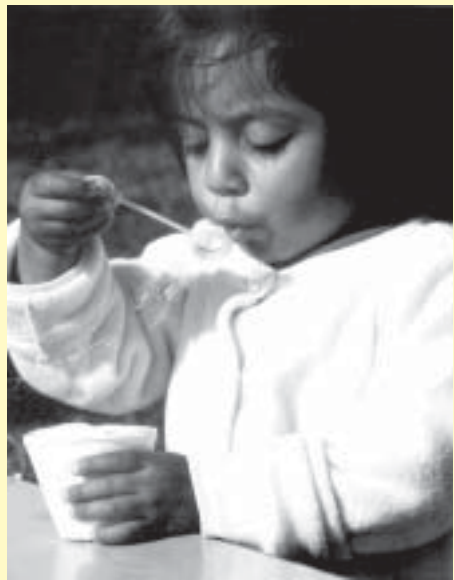

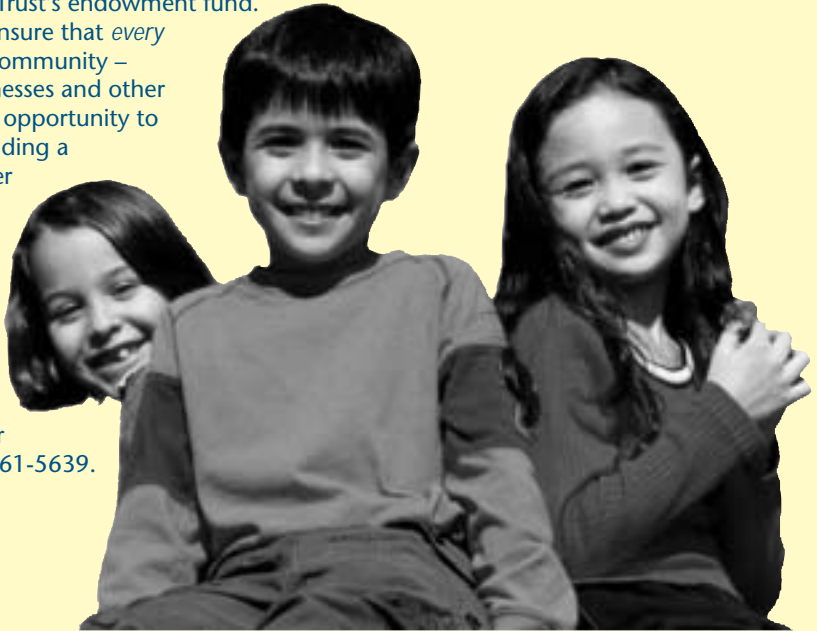


The Spirit of Philanthropy is Partnership
